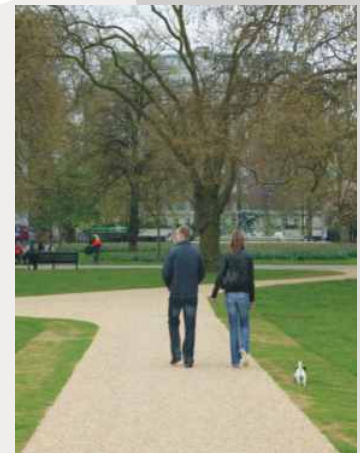


An effective solution to problems above and below the road surface

Application Details

The surfacing which comprised of a double application of 6mm golden gravel aggregate, included significant amounts of masking to protect pathway edgings and areas surrounding points of interest.

This level of care and attention to detail all went toward achieving the high level of finish demanded on such a project.
